More than half of survey respondents indicated they would NOT have access to naloxone without OPEN's vending machines.

Harm reduction supports people who use drugs (PWUD) by emphasizing safety and overdose prevention over judgment. Recognizing that not all PWUD are ready to stop using drugs or enter treatment, harm reduction aims to meet them where they are and promote safer practices. This compassionate, person-centered approach enhances public health and individual well-being through access to treatment, naloxone, overdose prevention education, safe use supplies, wound care, and safe syringes.
